### **PROCEDURES:**

Registration will be done on-line at [www.wctc.edu/cjtraining](http://www.wctc.edu/cjtraining).

- Click on Police In-Service Training – Registration link
- Training will be Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Thursday half-day sessions.
- **Individual Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday sessions as well as Thursday classes will be available after the priority registration period of 3-day sessions.**
- The cost of full day training is **\$30.94** per day/per officer.
- Thursday half-day class will be **\$17.72** per day/per officer.
- **Individual Officer's names and email addresses MUST be included in registration process.**

### **CLASS SIZE:**

- Monday - DAAT/Use of Force 24 students per class
- Tuesday - Legal Update /Managing Explicit Bias/  
Social Media Investigations 36 students per class
- Wednesday –MILO Live Fire & Shoot House/VPT 24 students per class  
**Wednesday class requires each student to bring a handgun along with 50 rounds.**

Thursday half day classes are separate topics a.m. and p.m., which will require separate registration.

- Thursday AM (ONLY) –Vehicle Pursuit Training 16 students per class
- Thursday PM (Afternoons Fall) Legal Update 36 students per class
- Thursday PM (Afternoons Spring) Legal Update/

Officers will review the legal basis for the use of force when controlling subjects who are exhibiting MSB. Officers will review tactics to control subjects who are exhibiting MSB. The instruction will re-enforce that the officer's goal is to stabilize and get the subject into the EMS system.</li> <li>• <u>Room Clearing Techniques</u> The principles and techniques of slow, static room clearing will be taught and reviewed through lecture, drill, and scenario based training.</li> </ul>
