PROCEDURES:

Registration will be done on-line at www.wctc.edu/cjtraining.

- Click on Police In-Service Training – Registration link
- Training will be Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Thursday AM only sessions VPT (Vehicle Pursuit Training). **Individual Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday sessions as well as Thursday classes will be available after the priority registration period of 3-day sessions.**
- The cost of full day training is **\$30.57** per day/per officer.
- Thursday half-day class will be **\$17.54** per day/per officer.
- **Individual Officer's names and email addresses MUST be included in registration process.**

CLASS SIZE:

- Monday – Ground Defense/Rescue Task Force 24 students per class
- Tuesday – Legal Update /Tactical Fitness Training/
Officer Involved Shooting Debriefs/Social Media 36 students per class
- Wednesday – EVOC/Live Fire MILO 24 students per class
 - **This class requires each student to bring a squad rifle and handgun along with 50 rounds for each weapon.**
- Thursday AM (ONLY) –Vehicle Pursuit Training 36 students per class

REGISTRATION GUIDELINES:

Fall: For departments wishing to register for Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, priority registration will be offered beginning *Tuesday, July 12, 2016*. Registration for individual Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursday AM will open up beginning *Tuesday, July 26, 2016*.

The concepts utilize simple, effective techniques based on gross motor skill movement. Techniques range for simple ground defense techniques that allow the officer to get up safely, to dynamic assaults that force an officer to use deadly force. • <u>Rescue Task Force</u> Is an integrated public safety response to a mass casualty incident for the purpose of maximizing the survivability of casualties by decreasing paramedic to patient response time.

Officer's service weapon and squad rifles will be used. • <u>EVOC</u> Classroom discussion on topics relevant to emergency driving followed by practical driving exercises including reactionary driving and deployment of tire deflation devices.
