The parties of this agreement, WTCS and the Lakeland University Elementary and Middle School (K-9) Teacher Certification Program, hereby agree to the following terms and conditions:

- **Eligibility for Admission:** Completion of the Associate of Applied Science – Foundations of Teacher Education at a WTCS college. Upon admission to the University, students also must apply for admission to the Education Program. Students with the conferred A.A.S. in Foundations of Teacher Education who meet all requirements will be guaranteed admission to LU's Education Program.
- **Transferring as an Associate Degree Graduate:** Associate degree graduates from the WTCS are eligible to transfer up to 72 credits (semester hours). Applicants who have additional college-level coursework from a four-year regionally accredited institution may be eligible for additional transfer credit. Transcripts will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis to ensure the maximum acceptance of transfer credit.
- **Curriculum:** The applicant agrees to complete the remaining coursework in the Elementary and Middle School (K-9) Teacher Certification Program, in addition to any other general studies coursework required for the Bachelor of Arts degree.
- **Graduation Credits:** A minimum of 120 credits (semester hours) is needed to confer the Bachelor of Arts degree at Lakeland University. Also, a minimum of 30 credits (semester hours) of college credit must be earned through Lakeland University.
- **Publication of Agreement:** Each institution may market this agreement.
- **Continuation of Agreement:** This partnership is effective May 1, 2024, and will continue until May 1, 2029, with a set agreement review to begin in January 2029; OR until either party requests the dissolution of said partnership in writing and signed by the authorized representative.

PROGRAM**


The purpose of this document is to establish a cooperative relationship between Lakeland University and the sixteen (16) schools in the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) to provide a baccalaureate degree opportunity to students who are completing an Associate Degree in Applied Science in Foundations of Teacher Education (including the embedded Teacher Apprentice program) and wishing to enroll in LU's Elementary and Middle School (K-9) Teacher Certification Program. This partnership will assist in better serving the needs of associate degree students with personalized admissions and academic advising services throughout the student's degree path.

WHEREAS, in consideration of this partnership, the WTCS schools will allow LU to provide students with information about LU's Elementary and Middle School (K-9) Teacher Certification Program through mutual agreed upon channels of communication; and,

THEREFORE, LU recognizes that a partnership with WTCS schools will provide students enrolled in the agreed upon program one tuition-free course.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, LU will provide a consortium scholarship to completers of the WTCS Foundations of Teacher Education program which is equal to a 20% discount for the remainder of a student's baccalaureate studies at LU, assuming student continues pursuit of the Elementary and Middle School Education (K-9) major. Upon meeting all LU admission requirements, students are guaranteed the following: Admission to LU's Education Program, entry with junior class standing, application fee waiver, and support from LU advisors.

This partnership is effective May 1, 2024, and will continue until May 1, 2029, with a set agreement review to begin in January 2029; OR until either party requests the dissolution of said partnership in writing and signed by the authorized representative.
