The purpose of this articulation agreement is to provide a seamless transfer process for students enrolled in the Associate of Arts: Psychology Pre-major program at Waukesha County Technical College (WCTC) who seek to use the elective credits within that degree to pursue a pre-major pathway to a Bachelor of Psychology at Lakeland University (Lakeland). Through the collaborative efforts of faculty, student services, and administration, WCTC and Lakeland will provide students with a clear path to reach their educational goals.


Students who complete the Associate of Arts: Psychology Pre-major at WCTC will be eligible for guaranteed admission to the Bachelor's in Psychology program at Lakeland. Students who complete the occupational courses listed below as part of the conferred Associate of Arts: Psychology Pre-major degree at WCTC will have those courses applied in transfer toward the requirements of Lakeland's. Per the transfer guide below, students would need to complete the courses listed under the heading of "Courses Needed to Complete Degree at Lakeland University" to be awarded the Bachelor of Psychology. Students also are eligible for all benefits and incentives outlined in the parent transfer agreement, including guaranteed admission to Lakeland with junior standing. The document below outlines the curriculum that will guide both parties in implementing and monitoring this agreement.

Elective credits will vary based on individual student transfer. Please work with your advisor to find the best way for you to use your elective credits at Lakeland to best further your career. Some of the most popular options include; taking more classes at WCTC, adding another emphasis/major/minor, other Lakeland classes where the student has interest, internship, Credit for Prior Learning (up to 10 credits), and up to 9 credits in master level classes (these credits can again be used when pursuing a masters at Lakeland University)
