



# Articulation agreement for the BS Food Science Chemistry at Mount Mary University and the Baking/Pastry Technical Certificate at Waukesha County Technical College

This articulation agreement outlines plan of study between Mount Mary University (MMU) baccalaureate degree and the Waukesha County Technical College (WCTC) Baking/Pastry Technical Certificate. Under the terms of the agreement, MMU students who are a). enrolled in the Food Science Chemistry Program, b). have a GPA 3.0 or better and c). who choose to obtain the concentration in baking to fulfill their B.S. degree, will be placed into the Baking/Pastry Technical Certificate program at WCTC. Upon successful completion of the certificate, students may transfer the WCTC credits back to the MMU Food Science Chemistry program and complete the B.S. degree with a Concentration in Baking. Alternatively, WCTC students who successfully complete the Baking/Pastry Technical Certificate, as well as meet the requirements for enrollment at MMU, will be able to transfer the credits to the MMU Food Science Chemistry program and complete the B.S. Food Science Chemistry degree with a concentration in baking.

This program supports the demand from the local Milwaukee food industries for food scientists with baking education. The Milwaukee Region, having the highest concentration of workers in the food industry in the United States, employs an ever-increasing number of employees in the Snack Food and Wholesale Baking industry.

Each year, a minimum of 2 seats in the baking/pastry certificate at WCTC will be available for MMU students who have met the pre-requirements as agreed upon by the Associate Dean of School of Business (WCTC) and the Dean of Natural and Health Sciences and Education (MMU). More seats will become available at WCTC upon mutual agreement of the two institutions as the Food Science Chemistry program at MMU grows in size. WCTC students who wish to pursue the BS Food Science Chemistry degree will have a guaranteed admission to MMU with satisfactory prerequisite requirements and satisfactory progression in the Baking/Pastry certificate. The credits from the Baking/Pastry certificate (9 credits), as well as any additional college credits that meet the criteria for acceptance to MMU will be transferred directly into the Food Science Chemistry Program at MMU.

Financial Aid, Payments, Registration for the Baking/Pastry Technical Certificate

For students enrolled in the MMU Food Science Chemistry Program who are pursuing the Baking/Pastry Technical Certificate at WCTC, Financial Aid will be administered by MMU. This program requires coordination between the registrar's and business offices of MMU and WCTC. The financial agreement of payment to WCTC is attached (Attachment 2). The MMU business office will bill MMU students for all four years on a semester basis and coordinate with WCTC for payments owed to WCTC. MMU's refund policy will be in effect for all students of this program. The registrar's offices of WCTC and MMU will exchange student grade and course data in a timely manner, maintain transcripts in both offices, inform students of academic regulations and registration guidelines.

Financial Aid, Payments, Registration for the WCTC Students Transferring to MMU

Students that have already obtained the Baking/Pastry Technical Certificate at WCTC and who have met the requirements for enrollment in the BS Food Chemistry Science program at MMU, will become eligible to apply for financial aid through MMU according to the procedures and policies set forth by the university.

This agreement will be in place for 5 years and reviewed annually by the MMU Graduate Program Director, MMU Business Office, and WCTC.

#### **Attachment 2: Financial Agreement**

Mount Mary University will bill all students enrolled in the B.S. Food Science Chemistry program at a tuition rate of \$970.00 per credit and \$340.00 for general fees beginning the Fall Semester 2021-2022. The tuition may be adjusted annually according to tuition increases approved by the Board of Trustees of Mount Mary University.

The students participating in the Baking Certificate will be billed by Mount Mary based on WCTC's pricing structure as of Fiscal Year 2021-2022 rate (see below details). Any annual price increases affecting tuition rates or fees will be provided by WCTC to Mount Mary University six months in advance of the effective date of change.

Mount Mary will calculate the WCTC fees per student on a semester basis and issue payment a week after Mount Mary University Census Date.
