# **Group Dynamics course**

This course is for individuals who have been convicted for the first time of operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated (OWI).

Individuals convicted of operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated may be required by the Alcohol Assessment Agency in their county to complete this course as part of a Driver Safety Plan specified by Wisconsin law.

The Group Dynamics course is designed to meet the needs of persons not addicted to alcohol or drugs. Small groups meet in a classroom setting for a total of 21 hours on weeknights, weekdays or Saturdays.

## Registration

You must register for the first available course within one week of the release date on your Order for Assessment and Driver Safety Plan Report. Failure to register will result in non-compliance and loss of your driver's license. If you need to transfer to a different section after registering, the transfer must be done 5 business days prior to the start of the course. If you request a transfer after the course has started, you must re-register and pay the subsequent fee.


