WELCOME EARLY CARE & EDUCATION PROFESSIONALS!

Did you know? As an ECE professional in Wisconsin, you could earn Endorsement® and join the largest and most recognized Infant Mental Health (IMH) credentialing system available in the United States!

Use this toolkit to learn more about IMH Endorsement®, the benefits it provides to The Registry's Infant Toddler Credential graduates, and how to apply to obtain this internationally recognized credential.

The <u>Wisconsin Alliance for Infant Mental Health (WI-AIMH)</u> is a statewide organization that strives to promote infant mental health through building awareness, promoting professional capacity, fostering partnerships, and supporting policies which are in the best interest of infants, young children, and their families. WI-AIMH aims for all Wisconsin infants and young children to reach their fullest potential through nurturing and consistent relationships within the context of family, community and culture.

WI-AIMH has partnered with <u>The Registry</u> and the Registry Infant Toddler Credential to expand Endorsement®. Through our collaboration with The Registry, it was discovered the Registry Infant Toddler Credential curriculum aligns with the recognized IMH competencies, theoretical foundations and learning experiences that will equip early care and education professionals to provide high quality, culturally sensitive and relationship-based care to infants, toddlers and their families within the framework of infant mental health.



INFANT MENTAL HEALTH (IMH) is the developing capacity of children from birth to 6 to experience, regulate, and express emotions; to form close relationships; and to explore the environment and learn – all in the context of family, community, and cultural expectations for young children. IMH is a multidisciplinary field that includes all professionals who support children's social and emotional development through promotion, prevention, intervention and/or leadership.





What is IMH Endorsement®? Endorsement for Culturally Sensitive, Relationship-Focused Practice Promoting Infant Mental Health® is an internationally recognized credential that supports and recognizes the development and proficiency of professionals who work with or on behalf of infants, toddlers, and their families. It is based on a set of Competencies designed to support and enhance culturally sensitive, relationship focused practice within a framework of infant mental health. An applicant demonstrates acquisition of these competencies through education, work, training and reflective supervision experiences.

What is the Registry Infant Toddler Credential?

The Registry Infant Toddler Credential is a 12-credit, 4-course series offered by accredited higher education institutions located throughout Wisconsin. This credential is designed for providers who work with children under the age of three. Students taking this credential gain understanding of the developmental stages of children under the age of three while learning how to best guide and nurture children in both centerbased and family settings. Themes of cultural sensitivity and reflective practice are woven through the course series which align well with Infant Mental Health Endorsement®.

Why pursue Endorsement® if I have an Infant Toddler Credential?

Completion of The Registry's Infant Toddler Credential represents a significant step in one's professional career equipping them with essential education for working with infants, toddlers, and their families. Endorsement® provides added professional credibility by validating the additional training, work and reflective experiences that make up the full range of specialized knowledge and experiences one needs for IMH informed practice leading to the best outcomes for children, families and communities. Endorsement® is:

Good for You: Enhances professional credibility and confidence as a specialist in the infant and family field.

<u>Good for Babies</u> and Families: Supports infants, toddlers, families, and professionals in a culturally competent, reflective, and relationship-based way.

Good for Communities: Provides assurance to families, agencies, employers and the public at large that the Endorsed professional meets high standards of care.

Good for Employers: Verifies professionals have attained a specified level of functioning and understanding about the promotion of IMH and relationship-based approaches to working with this specialized population.

Good for the Field: Informs professional development and career planning within an organized framework; creates a competent, high quality workforce leading to

desired child/family outcomes; and uplifts the professional credibility of the IMH field and the multiple disciplines within the field, including Early Care Education.







What category of Endorsement® is right for me?

Endorsement®, like Infant Mental Health, is cross-sector and multidisciplinary. Endorsement® indicates an individual's efforts to specialize in the promotion and practice of infant or early childhood mental health within their own chosen discipline. For this reason, Endorsement® has four categories that are tied to an individual's scope of practice. *Many Infant Toddler Credential graduates find Category I: Infant Family Associate to be most appropriate based on their education, training, work experience and scope of practice.*

The categories of Endorsement® are:

- Infant Family Associate (IFA) for professionals whose work centers on the promotion of social and emotional development
- II. **Infant Family Specialist** (IFS) for professionals whose work focuses on prevention
- III. Infant Mental Health Specialist (IMHS) for professional's who provide IMH clinical intervention and treatment
- IV. **Infant Mental Health Mentor** (IMHM) for leaders in the infant-family field
 - -Clinical (IMHM-C)
 - -Policy (IMHM-P)
 - -Research / Faculty (IMHM-R/F)

How do I apply for an Endorsement®?

Step 1: Get Ready...Preparation to complete an Endorsement® application:

Prepare the following information applicable to the Endorsement® category in which you are applying based on the Infant Mental Health Competencies associated with the category:

- Request official transcripts from universities in which higher education courses or degrees were completed sent directly to WI-AIMH for upload to your Endorsement® application after registration. (Attn: Tina Hogel, WI-AIMH 133 S. Butler St. Suite 340 Madison, WI 53703)
- Gather details of at least **30 hours of additional continuing education training** in topics related to IMH competencies (i.e. date, duration, facilitator, and topic).
- Prepare descriptions of <u>infant-toddler related work experience</u> as it relates to IMH competencies.
- Identify of **three professional references** that meet the reference requirements for the category in which you are applying and are familiar with your knowledge and practice. See the <u>Reference Rating forms</u> for details of what references will be asked.

Requirements for each category of IMH Endorsement® vary. If you believe you may qualify for Category II, III or IV review the Endorsement® Overview Chart for a brief overview of respective requirements, use the Which Endorsement is Right for Me? decision tree, as well as see the detailed IMH Endorsement® Competency Guidelines for full in-depth descriptions and examples to determine which category is the best fit for your education, experience and scope of practice. Step 2: Completion of an Endorsement® Application:

Five steps to completion of IMH Endorsement® application:

- 1. Register in the Endorsement Application System (EASy), a web-based system for completing applications for IMH Endorsement® found here (https://easy.mi-aimh.org/wi-aimh). The first time you visit Wisconsin's EASy, click "Register" under "New Applicant."
- 2. To register, EASy requires you to provide a brief description of your work, education, and Reflective Supervision (RS) experiences (RS is not required for IFA, IMHM-R/F or IMHM-P). Complete and submit, including payment for EASy Registration Fee. (See your IT Credential instructor to receive a coupon code to waive EASy registration fee as a graduate of The Registry's Infant Toddler Credential!).
- **3.** Prepare application following prompts imbedded within the application, using resources provided in this toolkit and contacting WI-AIMH coordinator with questions; submit official transcripts and three references. **Submit completed application** along with payment for the EASy Processing Fee at one of four recurring quarterly submission periods (i.e. Mar 15th, Jun 15th, Sept 15th or Dec. 15th).
- 4. Documentation of competencies and eligibility components reviewed by two Endorsed reviewers.
- **5.** Upon recommendation from formal review, **IMH Endorsement**® **granted!*** (*Note: for Category III & Category IV successful completion of written Endorsement® exam required).





Step 3: Maintaining your Endorsement®

To maintain Endorsement®, every year professionals complete and document 15 hours of continuing education related to the promotion of Infant Mental Health competencies in addition to maintaining membership in the Wisconsin Alliance for Infant Mental Health or another IMH association. See the Step-by-Step Endorsement® Renewal Guide for details for documenting ongoing continuing education.
